What's my child been doing this week?

Reception	Writing superhero stories, practising adding using a numberline and starting making Christmas decorations.
Year 1	Imagining, writing about and making dragons, investigating wheels and axles, learning about the symbols of Sukkot.
Year 2	Planning our own chapter of 'The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark, solving money problems and acting out the Great Fire of London stories.
Year 3	Learning about the 24-hour clock, retelling the story of Beowulf, and practising our dance.
Year 4	Using apostrophes, learning the formal method for subtraction and finding out about life in Britain in 1950's.
Year 5	Long multiplication in columns, writing descriptively and editing our writing, learning places on the high street in French.
Year 6	Writing about Victorian Christmas traditions, using ratio and proportion in maths, and investigating the differences between the lives of the rich and poor in Victorian times.
