Ocean Adventures

English: we will

- read and discuss Kensuke's Kingdom and Alone on a Wide Wide Sea by Michael Morpurgo
- write stories about adventure and survival
- learn about and write different forms of poetry
- develop our non-fiction writing skills by writing persuasive arguments, reports and travel blogs
- continue to practise accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar.

Maths: we will

- deepen the children's understanding and improve their fluency of in key aspects of:
- number and place value
- four formal calculation methods
- Fractions
- decimals
- geometry
- measures

Geography: we will

- use a range of sources including maps and atlases to explore the seas and oceans of the world
- develop an understanding of hemispheres, longitude, latitude and time zones around the world
- find out about coastal features and how they are formed
- use 4 figure grid references to locate places in the world
- investigate how tsunamis are formed.

P.E. we will

- compete with others and keep track of personal best performances, setting challenging targets for improvement.
- learn to strike a bowled or volleyed ball with accuracy as part of cricket and rounders games.
- create dance sequences.

Art and DT: we will

- learn to use single point perspective and start to develop an awareness of proportion and composition
- design and create moving toys that involve using cams and axles
- use the work of Hokusai and Yayoi Kusama to inspire our ocean art

Computing: we will

- Use numbers to determine the speed of a car in a game.
- Create data collection forms and enter data accurately using the most appropriate application
- use a range of websites to carry out research linked to our geography work and consider their reliability and validity.

Science : we will

- find out about living things and their habitats
- learn about life cycles and the stages of human growth
- watch part of the life cycle of chicks while they are in the classroom

Music: we will

- Perform as part of a group
- Improvise and create tunes and rhythms to accompany a known piece of music

French: we will

- speak in sentences using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language.
- learn phrases associated with food, friends and family

Religious Education: we will

- consider how and if religion, particularly the Holy Spirit, inspires people to behave differently
- Discuss and investigate how believers help others through charity and service
